When Carrie Hamstra passed away from ALS, she left behind many broken-hearted friends and a closet full of amazing clothes. Rather than simply donate her clothes to an organization, Carrie's friends decided to create a legacy in Carrie's name, using them as a starting point. Led by Courtney Tulbert, they acquired other donations of high-quality clothing items and started the nonprofit Carrie's Closet, to bring a pop-up boutique shopping experience to women who are exiting homelessness.

Carrie was a huge lover of fashion and when she could no longer care for herself toward the end of her life, her friends would pull together coordinated outfits for her for each week, lining them up for the nurses to put on her each day. Incredibly opinionated about everything she wore, Carrie would give an enthusiastic, "Yes!" or a firm, "No." to each item. "One of the things that kept her going...was the fact that she could still choose what she wore," says Tulbert, reminiscing about her late best friend. "We thought, well, if that kept her going and she knew that her end was not going to be one of ever coming out of that hospital bed, how would that be for women who did have a choice to turn things around for themselves?"

And so, Carrie's Closet was born. Loaded with clothing donations from all over the world, the fledgling nonprofit hosted its premiere pop-up at Morris Foundation Family Services Center this past November, followed by another again in February, and a third scheduled for May. The guests are incredibly grateful for the opportunity to work with a personal stylist and select complete outfits for job interviews, a parent-teacher conference, or even just an evening out.

"I have three job interviews this week," said one guest, beaming as she descends in the elevator, shopping bags filled with new outfits, "these clothes are a real blessing! I feel so confident and I'm ready to get that job!"



From Homeless to Home!

Each Monday morning, we ring our chapel bell - one time for each person who exits homelessness that week and moves into a home of their own. That bell has been ringing a lot more lately, thanks to our *Journey Home Housing*. The first Monday of March, the bell rang 47 times, it's bright sound of hope echoing across our campus. What made that number even more exciting was knowing that 18 of those bell rings represented children - 18 children who moved out of the Shelter and are now sleeping in their own beds. 
